The Cold War Exemption affects those who served in the military from September 2, 1945 through December 26, 1991 who are not currently receiving the eligible funds or alternative veteran's exemptions. War vets get a \$12,000 exemption and another \$18,000 if they are a combat vet. It depends on how this would affect the tax rate; we need to know how many vets this would affect in order to see how it would affect the tax rate. The Board will look into the matter further and do more research before holding another hearing and have the assessors here.

## **Department Head Reports:**

Richard LaPier, Code Enforcement Officer, gave the following report: Building Codes issued seven permits for the month of June, did one inspection for an occupancy certificate and did four fire and safety property maintenance inspections.

Mr. Scozzafava reported that he has had numerous calls of people burning garbage at night. The police and the DEC have been contacted and will be checking into the matter. There are heavy fines in place for this now.

Ed Roberts, Building and Grounds had nothing to report. Mr. Scozzafava asked him if he purchased the have a heart traps and was told they did.

Councilman Salerno gave the following Water & Sewer report: the department fixed sewer laterals that collapsed on Community Street in Grover Hills. They worked on water breaks on Decker's Flats and Mountain Spring Road. They have been doing their regular mowing and helping Building & Grounds who have been short staffed. They worked with the Highway Dept. in Grover Hills on the Federal Street repair, worked with the beach crew putting in docks and moving them back due to high water, they sent a backhoe to the beach to help move sand and helped highway build a wall at the beach due to erosion from high water.

Councilman Salerno reported that water will be turned off on July 24<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM to fix the pressure reducing valves. Affected areas will be Tarbell Hill, Fisk Road and all of Water District #4. Mr. Scozzafava stated that flyers should be taken door to door for those that will be affected by the water shut off.

Councilman Salerno gave an up-date on the campsite. The July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend was very busy with transient sites filled. They had to put those with tents on different sites as the tent sites were under water. Some campers had to be moved due to high water. They have 162 seasonal sites filled. The YCC is working there staining picnic tables. We are the best shape we've been in in years.

The Supervisor stated that we were losing sites, water and power lines due to the high water. We put in for an emergency permit to put shock rock on the shore line so we wouldn't lose anymore; we had the permit in two hours. We've spent \$10,000-12,000 for repairs and are hoping to utilize some of the grant money for payment. The Town crews did all the work and saved the Town a lot of money; they did a great job.

Councilman Salerno stated that we have two full-time seasonal workers (Justin Briggs & Mark Scozzafava) at the campsite and asked the Board to consider giving them sick time as they get nothing now. He suggested that they receive 20 hours for the remainder of this year and 40 hours per year after.

**RESOLVED** that the Town of Moriah Town Board authorize 20 hours per year of non-accumulative personal time (changed from sick time, no doctor's note required) to the two full-time campsite workers.

Mr. Salerno stated that he spoke with Chris Marin of CATS and he asked if the Town could mow around the old landfill for people that want to go that way to the trail. Mr. Scozzafava stated that the field was brush hogged by the highway this week.

Councilman Garrison gave the following highway report as Mr. Wilson was excused: Grover Hills project is in full swing with the base course of blacktop in place. Storm drains, manhole covers and water valves will be set to grade before the final course of blacktop is laid. Once done, all lawn area will be addressed as needed.

All departments helped out with an emergency erosion protection permit that was granted by the Army Corps of Engineers. The permit is only to slow down the erosion problem with a 300 foot area south of the beach. We put in 350-400 ton of stone in that 300 ft. section; filter fabric was installed behind the rock to help the sand from washing out through the rock. This will not solve the erosion problem, but it will buy us time until all engineering is in place and funds are available.

Also, the guys have started the roadside mowing, working with the County crews on Decker Flats, flagging, pulling shoulders, ditching and trucking; paving should be completed by the end of the week. The guys also worked at the transfer station on the pad for the metal pile, blacktop has started to be put in place and should be finished in the next few weeks.

Councilman Garrison gave the following Police report as Office Stahl has been excused. The Police Department handled 188 calls for service in June of which there were seven violation arrests, 15 misdemeanor arrests, four felony arrests, issued 23 traffic tickets and handled five traffic accidents.

Councilman Garrison reported that as far as Economic Development, within a couple of months he will be presenting a five year plan to the Board.

### **Supervisor's Report:**

- We are putting together an application (up to \$600,000) for an extension of an eight inch water main on Mt. Spring Road. We have a good shot at it. The surveys were sent out and it is critical that we get them back; without that information we won't get the money. If the surveys aren't all in next week we'll have to go door to door.
- Talked with the engineer about the punch list for Water District #4, there is a list of items that have not been completed. If they don't come back to fix things we will hold their retainage. There was money left from the project and we are looking into EFC letting us use that money to buy equipment for the Water Dept., a backhoe and a truck.
- Had a meeting with Jim and Gloria Virmala; they want to donate the Town Carriage that was owned by Witherbee/Sherman; it will be on display at the Iron Center.

- Received notification from Real Property that they will be mailing a questionnaire form to all commercial property owners in Essex County. If you have any questions regarding these forms we will turn them over to Paul Mazzotte.
- Received an inquiry from the Chamber to use the pier and the Powerhouse Park for the Labor Day doings, but we don't own it. Have contacted NYS Canal Corp and they see no issue, but asked that the Chamber contact them. They are glad that it is being used; the insurance will be covered under the Town's umbrella. It was discussed that the dock got twisted due to the high water and needs to be repaired.
- Received notification that we will no longer be able to burn brush at the transfer station; we are still trying to get a permit to burn what is there. Spoke with Cheyenne and we have stopped taking brush immediately (if someone comes in with a loaded truck we will take it until the word is out). The Board discussed how this would affect the community especially those in the Village and Grover Hills.

- Received notification that the tentative equalization rate is at 100 percent.
- The Verizon property dispute over the tower is no longer an issue, the property the tower sits on is on the Village/Town property as they thought. The Franken pine is up. We will be checking into the rent that we had agreed upon which they owe us from March through to present.

Ms. Smythe asked if they would be getting electricity at the traffic circle; Mr. Scozzafava stated that he had put power in the circle over a year ago. Apparently something failed and there is none; he will check it out.
