The Town of Moriah Town Board held their Regular Board Meeting on Thursday, November 12, 2015 at 6:00pm at the Town of Moriah Court House, 42 Park Place, Port Henry, New York.

# Floor Open to the Public:

Officer Stahl told the Board that the Moriah Police Department should be brought up to scale with other police departments such as Ticonderoga. He compared our department's salaries to Ti's stating an officer in Moriah takes 33 years to make what an officer in Ti makes in eight years and that Art makes \$7,500 less than an officer that has been in Ti for one year. The Supervisor stated that the Police Department is part of a bargaining unit and they had already met with him. The police are part of the Union which is included in the budget; this is the end of it, the budget is being voted on tonight. He also said that you cannot compare Moriah to Ticonderoga or any other town. Officer Stahl was unhappy with the police salaries using expletive language as he exited the meeting.

Jamie Wilson, Highway Supt., reported that this year his department has put in approximately 600 feet of concrete sidewalks, tore out about 2,500 feet of sidewalk and paved with blacktop. They paved two miles on Switchback, milled and paved Joyce Road and paved Barton Hill. They were reimbursed \$14,119.33 from Extreme Winter Recovery and received \$95,510.16 in CHIPS money.

Richard LaPier, Building Codes Officer reported that he issued six building permits and issued one notice of complaint in October.

There was no police report.

The Supervisor reported that Art Morgan was excused, but he can give a report. There were issues at the pump station on Titus Road; the pumps kept kicking out. We took the pump to Manion's to be repaired and found that it was an electrical issue with one phase of power they believe was caused by bumps in the power. We filed notice with National Grid and should be able to get reimbursed; Manion is working on the pump. DEC declared the pump station an emergency in August. Mr. Salerno asked if the insurance would cover it and was told they would not.

### **Town Board Reports:**

Councilman Anderson reported that Jack Armstrong reminded him that the minimum wage is going up \$1.00/hour by end of year. This will raise the Counselors wages up \$200 each for the summer program. The Supervisor thinks they will be okay; they have had money left in the

budget at the end of the year. They discussed the possibility of charging a fee for each student and Mr. Anderson said he preferred not to charge if they didn't have to.

Councilman Garrison had nothing to report.

Councilman Salerno reported that he will have the final report for the campsite next month; we are waiting for the final numbers. As far as Building and Grounds, they have been busy cleaning up and utilizing the inmates.

### **Supervisor's Report:**

- Have met with Matt Brassard regarding the Village dissolution to discuss the next steps involved. They are looking for someone from the Town and someone from the Village that has no opinion one way or another to sit on a Committee to come up with a plan that will work in a timely manner. In the Supervisor's opinion the plan shouldn't take more than six months to put together; the timeline is in the plan; then it is up to the Village Board to implement the plan.
- Have spoken with the Murray Law Firm (the County used this firm because of their knowledge regarding laws on cell tower sites) regarding the cell tower site because of the company we've been approached by to lease our site. Before we can transfer a lease it would be subject to permissive referendum. We need to get someone in here that knows more about the leasing than we do. Ms. Lovell asked if there is a time frame on the leasing and was told there wasn't.
- The Christmas Train will be here on the 29<sup>th</sup> around 4:45pm. Canned foods and donations go to the Food Pantry.
- Received a letter from Time Warner Cable to let us know the roads they will be submitting in conjunction with the NYS Broadband Funding Initiative. The roads they will be submitting are Cheney Road (7homes), Route 9 North/Route 22 (24 homes) and Mullen Bay (27 homes).
- Contract for police services: we provide the police for football games and in return they provide us bus services for the summer program.
