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THE 126th ANNUAL PORT HENRY LABOR DAY PARADE AND CELEBRATION

Yes! **126** years of celebrating! beginning Saturday September 5th with **Port Henry's very first Sailing Regatta** which will be held at the new Port Henry Marina, designated race time: 1pm. How is that for beginning a celebration?!

This year's first place regatta winner will receive a fully paid electric deck (slip) for the 2016 boating season, compliments of the Port Henry Marina. There will be other prizes from local Sponsors. David Koran, Port Henry Marina's manager and Organizer of the regatta said, "Port Henry is the ideal location for such an event with its multiple Marinas, and plenty of water front and public areas. This is also a great opportunity to support our local merchants by bringing boaters from other parts of New York and Vermont. We want to get the word out that Port Henry is the Labor Day weekend place to be." Continuing Saturday's great opening act to Sunday's festivities and parade, a DJ will be at the beach at 6:30 pm and, at dusk, fireworks will begin on the Pier.

Sunday, September 6th at 10 am, on Main and Church Streets, vendors will be offering their wares; children will be playing many different games, having their faces painted by Penelope the Clown and riding ponies; people will be noshing on BBQ chicken and all sorts of other edibles. Then - **The Parade**! at 1 pm_down Broad and Main; after which, more indulging in the above pleasures - until everyone is totally, happily exhausted.

VILLAGE BOARD MEETING NOTES, AUGUST 10th

The Board welcomed Pat Tom as their new trustee, replacing Staley Rich who requested release from trustee duties after finishing her work on Zoning.

The Campground is completely filled except for four camper sites and one tent site available for transients.

The Fact Finder would like to remind the residents of Port Henry just how many hours our **volunteer** Firemen donate, of **their** time, to **our** safety. Since the beginning of 2015, the department has responded to 39 calls (300.89 man-hours); OSHA Training (511 man-hours); additional training participation (642 man-hours); and it seems the hours required to maintain the equipment are just a bonus gift, not counted in the total man-hours expended (1,453.89). For all of us, Fact Finder would

like to say "Thank you!"

Chief Hughes, Captain Phil Smith and Daniel Olszanski from Adirondack Emergency Vehicles, LLC traveled to Beindlee Fire Apparatus in Huntsville, Alabama to inspect the 1999 Pierce 100 foot Platform Aerial Truck being considered for purchase. Upon close inspection, the consensus was to decline this purchase due to multiple maintenance items with this truck. After further evaluation, the fire department requests the bid process be started for a USED 1998, or later built, 75 foot Quint aluminum aerial ladder - not to exceed \$199,999.00 and which will **not** raise taxes. The last being a major requirement of a fire truck purchase.

Chip Perry reported that the water/sewer facility has been power washed and painted. A few complaints about drinking water were received and the cause has been corrected.

Beyond its usual village "house-keeping", Port Henry's DPW has been black-topping streets and will be draining the dam and cleaning it.

Elizabeth Street is a <u>completed project</u>! Rice Street is next in line for the same kind of complete re-do At last, the impossible seems to have become possible – the year-after-year headache, man-hole 13 project (formally aka the Manhole 13 Sanitary Sewer Reconstruction Project) finally has all the necessary money-ducks lined-up and another completed project will become a reality! Manfred Construction of Port Henry won the project bid, a nice bonus, having a Port Henry business do the job.

The village is required to have a Planning Board to satisfy certain requirements in petitioning for grants and other assistances. At least three more people need to step-up to the plate before the village can move forward in certain areas. You will be told what is expected of you and becoming a member of the Planning Board is simple, a sentence on a letter to the Mayor and Board of Trustees, "I am interested in being a member of the Planning Board.", sign your name and drop it off at Village Hall. You could mail it, but why spend a stamp?

A letter was received from Sue McHone of Lewald Street, requesting that a large sign be erected on Main Street to alert visitors and residents that there is a "**public beach**" near the Campground. She also suggested that the Village consider renting out kayaks, canoes and paddleboards at the beach which would provide local residents, as well as visitors an option for recreational use of the lake. Fact Finder has heard that, at the Bulwagga Bay campsite, paddle boards seemed to be choice #1, the "in" thing.

The Board revisited the previously tabled decision on the Water Adjustment Request received from Ronald Van Slooten, Sr. on the water and sewer billing structure for the Van Slooten Marina property. The decision was to stop flat-rate billing on water and go to metered billing. Billing for sewer service would be for one residential and two commercial properties, with a flat-rate business sewer. There would be three sewer debts and one water debt. This decision was in line with the handling of apartment buildings.

A special meeting was held on July 31^{st} to enact a resolution to set a date to hold a referendum (vote) on the proposition of dissolution. This Special Election will be held on **Tuesday, October 27, 2015**; voting will be held at the Port Henry Firehouse, the polls will be open from 12:00 pm – 9:00 pm. Only registered voters of the Village of Port Henry are permitted to vote on this dissolution proposition. All village residents should (at all times) exercise their right to vote but particularly in this case, as the decision made by this vote will affect, not only villagers' lives but the lives of <u>all</u> residents of the Town of Moriah - for at least six or seven years, if the vote is <u>against</u> dissolution and <u>forever</u>, if the vote is <u>for</u> dissolution.

It is never wise to vote for something you don't know about, so with that in mind, the Village Board has set dates for three Informational Meetings prior to the October 27th vote. These meetings will be held at the **Knights of Columbus Hall** at 4253 Main Street at 7:00 pm on <u>Tuesday, August 18th</u> (instead of August 19th as planned), <u>Wednesday, September 23rd</u> and <u>Wednesday, October 21st 2015</u>.
