Carol Chiarella-Chair of Finance Committee-Moriah Chamber: Ms. Chiarella went over the Moriah Chamber 2024 funding request from the Town of Moriah.

Farmer's Market: \$9,000 (Bidge View Harbour Marina (6/14/24-8/30/24)

Champ Day: \$2,300 (August 3, 2024)

Labor Day Fireworks: \$4,500 (Town pays directly)

Labor Day Parade \$3,995

\$19,795

Councilman Salerno asked Ms. Chiarella if the 12 bands were at \$525 each and Ms. Chiarella said yes. He then asked if the money could be given as needed as receipts are received. Ms. Chiarella stated the Chamber could always return what money is not used. The Supervisor stated this funding comes from bed tax money. He stated we could do each event separately. Ms. Chiarella stated that the Port Henry Fire Department pays \$1,200 for the bag pipes. Councilman Anderson stated he has a lot of questions; were the fireworks \$4,500 last year, Ms. Chiarella said yes. Rick Lewis stated they are always looking for cheaper pricing.

Councilman Anderson stated they have begun working on the Summer Program. Steve Pelkey will not be back this year so they will be looking for a Director. They will advertise for Counselors in April; everything should be taken care of by the end of May; 4-week program; tentative dates are July 8, 2024-August 2, 2024.

Councilman Salerno read the police report: Over 45 calls for February, 2024: 6 domestic, 14 traffic tickets, 5 car accidents and assisted State Police and Sheriff's Department on several other calls.

Councilman Salerno stated the water and sewer program needs a jetter and camera; Art Morgan is working on getting a  $2^{nd}$  quote; will put off for one more month.
